Craig is available in Term 3 Week 4 (Monday 31st July- Friday 4th August 2023) to conduct illustration tutorials with FNQ schools who may be interested. As a well recognised illustrator and author, we have successfully used Craig (in partnership with Elizabeth Honey) across seven of Daradgee's Year 6 Writers' and Illustrators' Camps.

Craig can work with schools individually or in clusters which may interest those looking at incorporating illustration into story telling. An example linking Craig's tutorial to the **Year 6 Arts Australian Curriculum** follows.

Craig's Notes/session details:

- · Tutorial will creatively engage participants and get to a satisfying outcome with their drawing.
- A day in school could involve 3 or 4 substantial sessions, whichever suits the school's timetabling.
- Large student groups are OK, best results are with less than 100 students.
- Students need A4 or A3 paper (photocopy paper), backing board if on the floor, and an HB or 2B pencil.

 An eraser can be useful.
- Craig requires a large whiteboard the bigger the better. *Alternatively*, can use a webcam setup plugging into the school's smartboard.
- Presentation is geared to the age of the audience K-12. (Mixed age OK).
- Sessions are 50-70 minutes long.
- Cost is based on \$600/day+GST. Please note, the agreed fee will be invoiced from Craig Smith beforehand, and become due two weeks after the booking.

The Arts - Visual Art Achievement Standard

Learning Area Achievement Standard

By the end of Year 6, students explain how ideas are communicated in artworks they make and to which they respond. They describe characteristics of artworks from different social, historical and cultural contexts that influence their art making.

Students structure elements and processes of arts subjects to make artworks that communicate meaning. They work collaboratively to share artworks for audiences, demonstrating skills and techniques.

Achievement Standard

By the end of Year 6, students explain how ideas are represented in artworks they make and view. They describe the influences of artworks and practices from different cultures, times and places on their art making.

Students use visual conventions and visual arts practices to express a personal view in their artworks. They demonstrate different techniques and processes in planning and making artworks. They describe how the display of artworks enhances meaning for an audience.

Visual Arts Content Descriptors

Explore ideas and practices used by artists, including practices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists, to represent different views, beliefs and opinions. (ACAVAM114)

Develop and apply techniques and processes when making their artworks. (ACAVAM115)

Plan the display of artworks to enhance their meaning for an audience. (ACAVAM116)
